2. The authors' name(s) should appear centred under the title. Articles should be in Microsoft Word format, 12 font size, and 1.5 line spacing.
3. Manuscripts must be clearly written in UK English and should be submitted in electronic format in Microsoft Word to editors@ajleejournal.com or online, through the [Journal website](#).
4. Submitted manuscripts will be subjected to plagiarism tests through *Turnitin*, *Grammarly*, and compliance with the Guidelines of the Editorial Team. Authors agree to transfer the copyright of their works to the AJLEE as the publisher through an executed Copyright Agreement.
5. Authors should strictly respect the intellectual property rights of other authors. Submitted works should not, to the best of the author's knowledge, contain anything that is libelous, illegal or infringes on anyone's copyright or other rights.
6. Manuscripts should also be accompanied by an Abstract, which summarizes the Manuscript in not more than 250 words. The abstract should clearly summarise the manuscripts, research methodology adopted, and state the manuscript's main argument and relevance to contemporary legal issues.
7. Manuscripts should be well referenced in automatically generated Arabic numbering footnotes (not endnotes) and must accord with the Oxford University Standard for the Citation of Legal Authorities (OSCOLA 4th edition) available at www.law.ox.ac.uk/oscola
